

Permanently Progressing? – Building secure futures for children in Scotland

is a ground-breaking study conducted by the Universities of Stirling, York and Lancaster, in collaboration with the Adoption and Fostering Alliance (AFA) Scotland. Phase One (2014-2018) investigated decision-making, permanence, progress, outcomes and belonging for a large cohort (**1,836**) of children in Scotland who became looked after in 2012-13, aged five or under. On **Wednesday 19th September 2018**, at the **Stirling Court Hotel** the research team will present key findings.
